
CAMPER TRAILERS VISIT PEAK HILL



The Australian Camper Trailers Group's 2008 national meet was held over the week from Monday 29th September at Peak Hill Showground.

The group raised \$702 towards

Overall total spending was just over \$21,000, an average of \$342 per camp. The Showground camp fees and money raised for the Preschool is also around 85%. \$2,500 could also be added to the above total.
